3. <u>Suber</u> v. <u>Suber</u>, (Superior Court, Chancery Division, Union County) Robert Brotman and James Coffee, Union County Legal Services Project.

Plaintiff-wife, a welfare recipient, in a divorce suit received an order from the court authorizing service by publication upon her husband. Motion has now been made on behalf of the plaintiff for an order directing either the Union County Welfare Board or the State of New Jersey to pay the costs and expenses of serving the summons in this action by publication. Jim Coffee, Director of Union County Legal Services stated, "Reducing the issue involved in this motion, it is whether an indigent plaintiff in a divorce action who is unable to effect personal service of a summons upon the defendant, and unable to pay the costs and expenses of serving a summons by publication, shall be denied access to the court solely because of her indigence."
