

Know Your Rights Against Illegal Evictions!



TENANTS

The only way a landlord can evict a tenant is by going to court, winning at trial, and doing a lockout with a court officer.

It is *illegal* for a landlord to try to force you to leave by:

- Changing the locks;
- Shutting off or disconnecting utilities;
- Putting your things out on the street; or
- Using any means to force you out other than compliance with lawful eviction procedures.
- A landlord must follow this law regardless of your immigration status.

If a landlord attempts to illegally evict you, call the police. If that does not immediately resolve the problem, you can get an emergency court order. Forms are available at www.njcourts.gov/forms/10916_rtn_prop.pdf.

You can file the forms online through the court's online portal, Judiciary Electronic Document Submission (JEDS), www.njcourts.gov/selfhelp/jeds.html, or take them to your local county courthouse, www.njcourts.gov/courts/index.html?lang=eng. A Legal Services lawyer may be able to help you with this.

HOTEL/MOTEL RESIDENTS & OTHER OCCUPANTS

Residents in hotels/motels must be removed through a court process, if they can show that they have lived there on a continual basis and have no other home to return to. Seek legal advice if you are living in a motel and the motel owner locks you out without a court order.
