New Jersey Laws Protect Workers in a Variety of Ways

- The New Jersey Wage and Hour Law and Wage Payment Law make it unlawful for employers to pay below minimum wage, withhold regular or overtime pay, or retaliate against workers who complain about pay violations.
- THE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION LAW provides for weekly benefits when an employee becomes unemployed through no fault of their own.
- THE NEW JERSEY LAW AGAINST
 DISCRIMINATION (LAD) makes it illegal
 to discriminate or treat an employee
 differently based on a specified list of
 characteristics
- THE CONSCIENTIOUS EMPLOYEE PROTECTION ACT (CEPA) protects whistleblowers from retaliation.
- THE DOMESTIC WORKERS' BILL OF RIGHTS extends LAD protections and wage and hour laws to cover domestic workers, such as nannies, house cleaners, and home care workers.
